What must I study?

You must study a 'core' curriculum of

English Language

English Literature

Maths

Science (Combined or Triple)

Personal Development

All leading to GCSE or equivalent qualifications

Nature of 'core' courses

- Assessment is linear (all exams taken at the end of the course)
- 100 % exam
- Much more of an emphasis on extended writing
- Assessment of Mathematical skills across the curriculum
- Graded as 1 9

The EBacc

A broad and balanced academic curriculum for all. All pupils will select a minimum of one Humanities subject (From Geography or History)

The EBacc is achieved when pupils achieve a good GCSE pass in all of the following subject areas:

- Mathematics
- English Language
- A Modern Foreign Language
- Two Sciences (From: Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Combined Science)

A Humanities subject: History or Geography

Pupils that follow the EBACC route you will choose either History or Geography and then have one 'free choice' of any subject offered at school.

Non-Examined Courses

Coursework based assessment

BTEC qualifications typically have 75% coursework and 25% exam

 BTEC courses are good if you are not confident at final exams

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General requirements for entry: 5 grades at 9-4, including English Language and Maths

Some subjects have specific entry requirements in addition to the general requirements

A Level Subjects	Subject Specific Entry Requirement
Art	If studied Art at GCSE grade 4 +
Business	If studied Business at GCSE grade 4 +
Economics	Minimum of GCSE Grade 6 in Maths
English Language	Minimum of GCSE grade 5 in English Language
English Literature	Minimum of GCSE grade 5 in English Literature
Geography	If studied Geography at GCSE grade 4 +
History	If studied History at GCSE grade 5 +
Maths	Minimum of GCSE grade 6 in Maths
Further Maths	Minimum of GCSE grade 7 in Maths
Core Maths	Minimum of GCSE grade 4 in Maths
Media Studies	Minimum of GCSE grade 5 in English Lang/Lit
Politics	Must have achieved a GCSE grade 5+ in English
Product Design	Minimum of GCSE grade 5 in DT or a Level 2 equivalent

A Level Subjects	Subject Specific Entry Requirement
Psychology	Must have achieved a GCSE 5+ in English and 4+ in Maths
Religious Studies / Philosophy & Ethics	Must have achieved a GCSE grade 5+ in English
Sociology	If studied Sociology at GCSE grade 4+
Spanish	Minimum of GCSE grade 6 in Spanish
Science: Biology	6+ in Biology, 6-6 in Combined and 5+ Maths
Science: Chemistry	6+ in Chemistry, 6-6 in Combined and 5+ Maths
Science: Physics	6+ in Physics, 6-6 in Combined and 5+ Maths
Applied Subjects	Subject Specific Entry Requirement
L3 Applied Diploma Criminology	General requirements
BTEC Health and Social Care	General requirements
BTEC ICT	General requirements
BTEC Performing Arts	General requirements and relevant performance skills
BTEC Sport	General requirements
