Dear Parent/Carer,

Through the My Child at School (MCAS) App you shall shortly be able to view the Year 7 Tracking Data for your child. You can do this by selecting the 'Reports' section within the menu of your child's page.

For each subject, the following information will appear on your child's tracking:

- Most Likely Outcome Grade (MLO) – this is the grade that your child's teacher feels your child is most likely to achieve at the end of Year 11. This considers recent assessment and work in lessons. We are aware of the potential for the increasing importance of these grades, they have been considered very carefully. There is of course a huge scope for pupils to improve these through an improved work ethic or improved academic performance. These grades have been entered for English and Maths only in Year 7.
- Average Subject Most Likely Outcome – this provides you with information on the year group average grade in each subject. This should help to contextualise your child's attainment and progress against the average performance in the year group.
- Meeting Expectations
 - 'Y' and a green-coloured box – this indicates they are meeting or exceeding their teacher's expectations
 - 'N' and an orange-coloured box – this indicates they are not yet meeting expectations. For further details, please contact your child's form tutor or class teacher in that subject via email. Please also refer to attendance and behavioural comments where appropriate to ascertain why teachers' expectations are not being met.
- A Behaviour for Learning Judgement ranging from outstanding, good, requires improvement or inadequate
- A Learner Level ranked from 1 to 9. In Year 7, pupils should typically receive a level between 3 and 5.

Further details of Learner Levels can be found below and on the parents' area of our website under the 'Learning at Forge Valley' tab.

This tracking will be used by Subject Leaders and the School Leadership Team to review the progress of each pupil in Year 7 and to assist all pupils in making future progress. I hope that this information will also be useful in supporting children and their families.

Learner Levels will continue to be the drivers for success. The Learner Level descriptions can be found on the website. Each Learner Level describes learning behaviours such as reciprocity (e.g. how pupils work with others effectively in groups), resilience, resourcefulness, reflectiveness and respect. At the lowest level (one) pupils are dependent upon their teacher in most respects but as they progress up the levels they become increasingly independent and reflective. We will make a 'best fit' judgement for each subject for every tracking report but it is not simply a summative assessment, it should also be formative. Pupils should work both in school and at home to build on their skills and strive to move to the next level.
