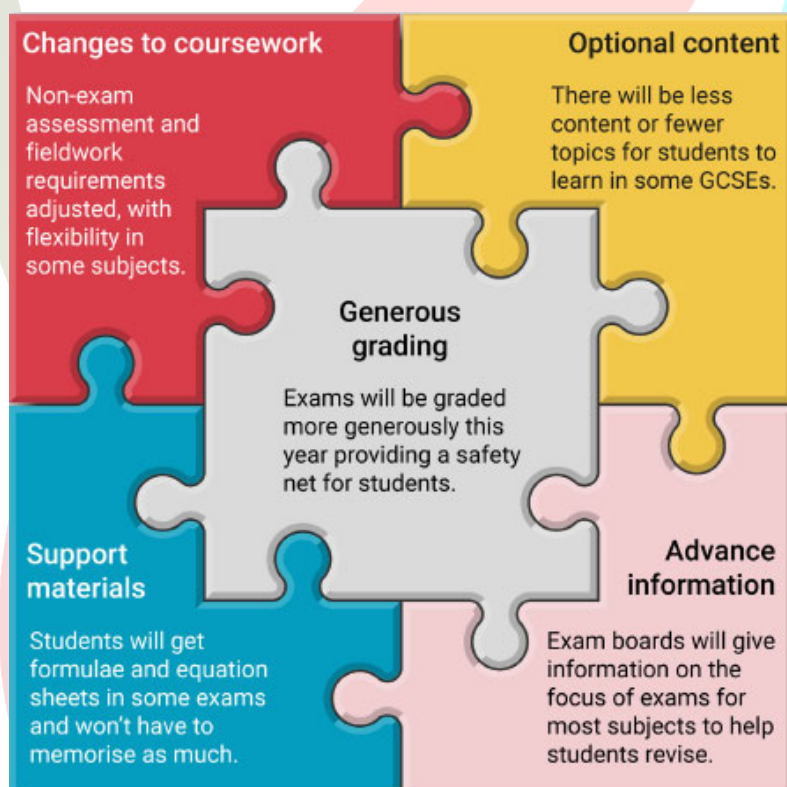

Summer Exam Arrangements 2022

On Monday 7th February 2022, examination boards announced further details of content and other specific information regarding summer examinations at both GCSE and A-Level. A summary of their principles is contained within the graphic below.



Our teachers, Subject Leaders, and Directors of Learning have been working hard to digest this information and where necessary adapt planning and revision guidance to support our pupils and students.

Planned 'Plan B' assessments and mock examinations shall continue as previously communicated with the same content. This shall take place for Year 11 pupils in the first week back after February half-term break and for both Year 11 pupils and Year 13 students following the Easter break, these

assessments will be used as evidence to support teacher assessed grades, should exams be cancelled. However, the message is clear that it is extremely likely that summer exams will take place in full for all pupils and students with these modified ways of examining. Please be reminded that dates of these are from Monday 16th May 2022 until Tuesday 28th June 2022 inclusive. Specific timetables for each individual pupil and student shall be shared after the Easter break.

Results day for A-Level students is Thursday 18th August 2022 and for GCSE pupils is Thursday 25th August 2022.

We shall continue to support all of our pupils and students in their preparation for summer exams. All Year 11 pupils shall receive a detailed booklet in both electronic and paper form containing specific, focused, revision tasks in all subjects. This shall be shared shortly after the next set of assessments. There shall be focused revision guidance for all A-Level subjects.

In addition, we shall continue to offer revision support for all families in a range of online events and events for pupils and students in school with increasing opportunities for pupils to participate in revision and learning activities after or before school. Please continue to support your child's attendance to these sessions when invited. They are excellent opportunities to make progress.
