Dear Parent/Carer,

At midday on Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> November Year 11 Tracking Data shall be uploaded to pupils' MCAS profiles. You can view this by selecting the 'Reports' section within the menu of your child's page. We have already begun to share assessment results and next steps in lessons with our Year 11 pupils in order to quickly drive progress.

I hope that this has focused the minds of pupils on what needs to be done to achieve what they need to meet their expectations. This will be achieved hand in hand with a focus on behaviour, attendance and the steps required to achieve target grades.

For each subject, the following information will appear in your child's data report:

- Target Grade – There has been a review of TSAT targets following the release of the provisional national examination results for summer 2022. These are the first set of externally sat GCSEs taken by students who completed the new key stage two tests in year 6 where scaled scores replaced National Curriculum levels. These targets remain highly aspirational for all of our pupils.
- Assessment Percentage – This is the percentage that your child achieved in the most recent assessments, taken in October 2022.
- Most Likely Outcome Grade – this is the grade that we believe your child is most likely to achieve at the end of Year 11. This will require continuing effort and application to learning. These **can** be improved with increasing work and focus within lessons and with endeavour at home and with revision.
- Sheffield Progress Grade - this will be the grade which goes on your child's Sheffield Progress application for post-16 destinations. Often this is a more optimistic grade to allow pupils access to a wider variety of post-16 options. This may have been amended from the previous time it was shared with families in October 2022, dependent on the progress your child has been making in lessons and with assessments.
- A Behaviour Judgement ranging from outstanding, good, requires improvement or inadequate
- Meeting Expectations
  - 'Y' and a green coloured box – this indicates they are meeting or exceeding their teacher's expectations. This may be followed by a specific comment if teachers feel appropriate.
  - 'N' and an orange coloured box – this indicates they are not yet meeting expectations. When a pupil has been marked as 'N' in any subject this will be supported by a specific teacher comment to provide further details on the support your child requires and specific areas for improvement. As above, this is in response to feedback received from families earlier this year.
- Additional Comment – there will be a detailed additional comment on specific next steps your child should take to improve their knowledge or exam technique.

This tracking will be used by Subject Leaders and the School Leadership Team to review the progress of each pupil in Year 11 and to help plan for success as we move towards next summer and final assessment and exams.

Please note that there is no assessment information included for pupils studying BTEC Sport. This is because pupils are currently working towards specific units of study. Further details of this will be shared by BTEC Sport teachers in due course.
